TRAITOR!

The "Liberal" organ has repeatedly charged the leaders of the Democratic party in Utah as being traitors to the people of Utah or national traitors from their supporting of a despised confederacy. It is now interesting that they are engaged in doing the same sort of work for election purposes, if not of obtaining it, from the Mormon Church.

There is no need for any particular detail of these charges. The party know pretty well that they are utterly false. The only conspiracy? in the matter is an open, free and strong alliance on the part of pronounced "Garrison Democrats and Republicans," to gain converts and supporters to their respective party organizations. The "Mormon" Church has nothing to do with the matter in any way. The "Mormon" people, as citizens of the United States, have much to do with it. And they ought to be active in what they do and manifest their interest in the issue that confront them, by casting their ballots next Monday against the candidates most friendly to the cause of the elective franchises.

It is quite natural that conjecture should suggest other people of conspiracy. That promoters of fraud and corruption should accuse just men of their own tricks. That workers in the dark should imagine men of the daylight are guilty of shady practices.

The truth is, the "Liberal" is trying to divert attention from what is going on in the "Liberal" ranks. The writer's function is to repeat the statements of the last annual convention. Well known "Liberal" have been overheard pronouncing recent appeals to vote for Monday and setting them aside to give up the right with the genuine that it shall be voted "Forth" style to them, though their own convention has located itself. We hope the writers for the Democrats and Republicans will be sure to make it interesting as well as "worth" while, to those who have not yet seen the "Liberal."

The names of dead men and of persons who have left the Territory have been left on the registration lists by "Liberal" regurgitators for "Liberal" purposes. Thugs are being kept in town to assassinate these dead and absent voters. The same "Liberal" kind of a crowd that was fed and lodged in this city previous to the municipal election, are lying about in the day time and going forth to prey upon pedestrians at night. Money is being collected for campaign purposes. The same old "Liberal" practices are to be resorted in.

Now, we earnestly advise vigilant practical investigation to heat off the villainy intended. Let them be no weakening at the last moment. Put good and true men at the polls. Prevents promoters and repeaters. Publish election offices who perpetrate frauds and unlawfully play into the hands of "Liberal" election managers. Arrest every illegal voter. Put a stop to the crimes which have disgraced our elections under "Liberal" direction and "Liberal" manipulation. Organize for the purpose, if ever good citizens lend their aid in the work.

Come out of your apathy, like "People's" party men, and take a hand in the struggle for good government! Your votes are wanted, your influence should be used. You are mistaken if you think that because the People's forces are divided, the common enemy can step in between and win the coveted prize. TO "HENTILE" VOTERS.

If the "Democrats" and "Republicans" and "Free Soil" judges of election are soon appointed on each county and town, it would be much better for a fair election next Monday. As it is, the Republicans have an uphill place of work on their hands to prevent a repetition of the frauds that have been committed under "Liberal" rule.

These desirable reforms have been repeatedly urged upon the Utah Convention, but to vain. It was in the power of that body to grant them. All the elected officers are appointed by the Constitution, and could be removed if they did not carry out the requirements imposed.

This Millet required, for just representation on the boards of election judges is so manifestly fair that its refusal, and the placing of the control of those boards in "Liberal" hands, particularly in view of the history of that faction, is so strikingly partial and unfair, that it may prove the beginning of the end of the body which is responsible for it.

THE STOOLS OF OFFICE.

This New York has very properly given public attention to the conduct of the last regular Utah department of agriculture. To what extent the modern office-holder regards his office as a personal gift intended for his private benefit is strikingly exhibited in this pamphlet.

The avowed purpose of the circular is to give the farmers of the United States the benefit of the best information available to the department on the subject of the hop-plants, and is prepared by the department entomologist, C. V. Riley, at the expense of the government, of course. Much is said by Mr. Riley which, if true, may be valuable information to the hop farmers of the United States, but the hops in general is only a secondary market, fitted in to give interest to the main question, touching the merits of Mr. Riley's patent "method."

Thus the government through Secretary of Agriculture, Mr. Riley, advertises his private business, at government expense and upon government authority.

To this official circular Mr. Riley is good enough to inform the public that there are other "methods" besides his to be used, but in does not have any claim on that reader's mind, as in which is the best for him to buy, and in the bargains on the spot as near as possible the customer is fully informed when the valuable "hops" can be purchased and how distinguished from imitation, etc.

Besides his salary to Mr. Riley, for his valuable services, the government is paying for the publications, and all the labor and sundry expenses of mailing a million or so of these private

advertisements to people who, Mr. Riley thinks most likely to be sensible persons.

This is so flagrant a case as could be desired of the abuse of office with which this Government is afflicted. It simply shows that the buxom-faced independence of the "office seekers" has been yielded to itself no longer makes the slightest effort to check its pecuniary operations. Under the design to the victim being the specific he makes his stand at the capital and the most wades boldly in for all he can get.

If the time has come to clean the "muck" who has office solely for personal gain, and to put in their place men whom the people seek for their honest and equality to perform the duties expected of them, then we should have many elections. For a man perfectly qualified could not be induced to accept the office for the most trifling sum.
