Coalville City, Summit Co., Utah, March, 1904 .- In looking over some old papers I found the following:

Memo on the last days of December, 1849, the Walker Indians, lead by Stickm-the-Head, warriors numbering 110, had the settlers corralled in the fort on Provo river, Word came to Governor Young. He ordered Capt. George D. Grant with company A, life guards, out. Post haste. Snow deep and crusted. When there, united forces with the Provo military. The first days of Jan-uary, 1850. The Indians opened fire on us at 5 o'clock a m. Thursday. Fought

us at 5 o'clock a. m. Thursday, Fought until 8 p. m. Cold ranging from 30 to 40. Snow crusted, would nearly hold our cavairy borses up. Fought Fri-day from 5 a. m. until 8 p. m., under a world of disadvantage. Saturday met the same open fire on us. Three slid.
