When the image arrives at a certain determined point the electric current is applied, and the explosion takes place immediately. The mines are numbered, and each has a corresponding mark in the chamber. The method of observation is simple and sure, and was adopted for the defense of Venice in the late Italian war. The trials succeeded perfectly, and are soon to be repeated on a larger scale.
