# FRANCE.

Mail Matter.-Viceroy of Egypt Preparing for War.

PARIS .- There is still much dissatisfaction regarding the mail service to the United States. The press is unanimous in calling for a reform.

The bourse opened excited, resulting from the reported alliance between Russia and Egypt. A great many can-non, muskets and other material have recently been ordered from Brussels and New York on the Viceroy's account, and a large increase in the armament at the disposal of the government is suddenly apparent, and it is now almost certain that the Viceroy is preparing for a struggle against the Sublime Porte
