EVENING NEWS.

Wednesday, May 2, 1883.

CITY COUNCIL.

Proceedings at the City Council Tuesday evening, May 1st, 1883. Alderman Raleigh presiding.

A petition was presented signed by D. C. Brown and 200 others, property owners and residents in the vicinity of the lot on block 100, Plat A, designated by the council as a site for the erection of coal oil warehouses, representing that said lot is on the line of the Utah Central Railway, and that heavy traffic, driven by steam engines pulling mail and frequent throwing from their smokestacks much fire or sparks which would create greater danger of explosion in case the Standard Oil Company locate upon said lot which would arise from a number of causes, among them being the fact that on block 97 of Plat A in 1881, a father and child were severely burned, though no fire was near and that other instances abundantly proved that under certain circumstances coal oil is highly explosive, and for many reasons the petitioners urged a reconsideration of the action locating said place for oil houses, and the petitioners urgently requested that all oil houses be located outside that portion of the city occupied by family residences. Laid over subject to call.

A petition was presented from Frederick Keebler, Bishop of the 16th Ward, and committee, protesting, on behalf of the inhabitants of the 16th Ward, against the erection of oil houses, and the petitioners represented that delegations had been sent to them by the residents of the 16th Ward, urging their opposition in finance in effecting a reconsideration of the action designating said places for oil houses, and the petitioners requested that the same be re-located. Referred to the watermaster with authority to act.

Andrew Gebhard petitioned for the use of a portion of the street and sidewalk next east to the Idaho Bakery on Second South Street, on which place building material was to be stored, and the petitioners referred to the watermaster with authority to act.

A petition was presented from James Sabine, stating that in making his home in Salt Lake City he has since 1870, made his residence in the 20th Ward. Last year, there were fourteen large shade trees north of his lot removed by the city, and asking that he be supplied with a like number of trees; also that, during the late flood, his shrubs had been considerably damaged, and he desired that the same be repaired. Referred to the watermaster with authority to act.

A bill of \$25 for pruning trees up on the Warm Spring Bath House grounds, was referred to the committee on claims.

Mr. Perry Neboher was present and addressed the Council in the interest of the residents of the locality in which the warehouse of the Standard Oil Company is being erected and urged in the strongest terms the claim of the inhabitants to recognition by the Council and the prevention of the establishment of a salacious and undesirable warehouse for the overwhelming protest against it.

The petitioners referred to a special committee consisting of Aldermen Spier and Patrick and Councilors Clark, J. F. Walker, and Watson, with instructions to inform the agent of the Standard Oil Company to change the location of said warehouse in consideration of the overwhelming protest against it.

Adjourned for one week.
