## LITTLE BUSINESS DONE ON 'CHANGE

### FOUR GREAT MINING CAMPS

Brokers Were More Interested in  
The Circus Parade.

#### A HALF DOZEN TRADERS.

Participated in the Sales of the FIRE—  
Aggregated Less Than \$1500—Close-  
ing Quotations.

The Ringling circus parade seemed to have its effect on the proceedings of the forenoon calls of the mining exchange. Brokers were more interested in the long string of gilded wagons, big elephants, bands and other things connected with a display of this sort than they were in buying or selling stocks. The total business of the forenoon did not come up to quite \$1,500 and only six of the traders posted on the big black board participated. Some expected to see Silver Shield stir up a little, but in this those who thought so were disappointed. Daly-West was held at \$39, but the only bid made for it was at \$38.50. May Day remained about the same as usual. No United States stock was offered, \$16.75 was bid.

#### WORKING SIXTEEN MEN.

#### Forces at the Yampa Mine Getting Ready for Smelter.

Superintendent W. J. Craig, of the Yampa mine of Bingham, is in from camp to confer with Manager George H. Robinson and incidentally to go to the Ringling circus. Of the mine he has nothing to report except a few small news items. The entire working force at this property at the present time consists of only sixteen men who are knocking down enough ore to fill the requirements of the contract entered into with the Bingham Consolidated smelter and cutting out stations along the upgrade which connects with the upper portion of the mine. The work is being done in preparation to the smelting of a large tonnage when the new smelter is ready to go into commission.

#### GOLD DUST MACHINERY.

#### Ten Stamp Mill Being Installed at Idaho Property.

The machinery for the Gold Dust Mining company, of which Dr. R. A. Hasbrouck, formerly in the lead, is manager, shipped to the property by the machinery firm, has arrived at its destination and is being set up. In the order was a 10-stamp mill and everything that goes with it, including an engine, boiler and a complete electric light plant.

Mr. Hasbrouck states that the mill will be able to pound out from 40 to 50 tons per day with the battery provided, the stamps weighing 900 pounds each. The capacity of the mill will be enhanced as rapidly as the development of the property permits.
