London, Nov. 29.-Lord Morley's nowerful speech was the absorbing event of the budget debute today in the house of lords. The secretary of state for India dilated on the importance of the struggle as viewed at home and abroad, and he called attention to the fact that foreign nations were watching anxiously the outcome of the conflict to see whether there would be any charge in England's fiscal policy.
