## JURY EXPENSE IN THE ALLRED CASE.

City Attorney Hogg presented the following, which was read and the required grant:

To the Honorable President and City Council:

I am forced to again call on your honorable body for a further appropriation of \$1000 in the case of Allred et al. vs. Salt Lake City, now on trial in session. After consideration, I will send my own report, and our solicitor, H. C. Hogg, will submit his report.

It is my opinion that the expense of our trial has been incurred in the interest of justice, and I trust the jury will be so inclined.

## THIRD READING OF ORDINANCES.

Chapters 8, 10 and 11 were passed without motion or amendment.

The chapter relating to the levy and collection of dog taxes was so amended as to make the tax on male dogs \$2. The tax for the keeping of a female dog was retained.

Chapter 12, on elections, 14, on city engineer, 15, on entry, 16, 18, on expenses, and 17, on fire department, were all passed without amendment.

The Council meets in regular session tonight.
