Eastern. Boston, 25.—There is not much activity in the wool market, but prices continue steady, and manufacturers still purchase from week to week sufficient to keep their machinery running.

General Strike. New York, 25.—The longshoremen resolve to-night to enter upon a general strike on Friday morning, their offer to compromise with the ship owners having been rejected.

The Day Observed—Beecher-Tilton-Dead. Evacuation day was observed by a display of bunting on the National, State, and municipal buildings.

Help for the Needy. MEMPHIS, 25.—The Chamber of Commerce committee have raised a thousand dollars in money and supplies for the Tusculuma sufferers.

Washington, 25.—Col. McClure, it is said, paid \$50,000 for the controlling interest in Forney's Press; this does not include the building.

The Jury Charged. Judge Humphrey's charge in the case burglary case occupied two hours.

Franklin, Ind., 25.—Ferdinand Huber's furniture establishment was burned this morning; loss \$12,000, insurance, \$3,000.

Muncie, 25.—A fire here to-day destroyed an entire block of wood on buildings; loss, \$10,000; uninsured.

A Forger Convicted. COLUMBUS, 25.—Milton Fisher, of this city, arrested some weeks ago at Kansas City and brought here for trial, was to-day convicted of forgery and sentenced to twelve years in the penitentiary.

Western. Killed. SAN FRANCISCO, 25.—William Rogers, a workman on the Palace Hotel, fell from the story of the building this afternoon, and was instantly killed; he leaves a wife and two children, who are in New York City.

Canada. Corruption Unsettled. MONTREAL, 25.—Mr. Hurlean, M. P. for L'Assomption, has been unseated by the election court, for corrupt practices by agents.

Mexico. Returns Adopted. CITY OF MEXICO, 25.—A majority of the Legislature have approved of the establishment of a Senate Chamber and other constitutional reforms, which will be declared integral parts of the constitution Sept. 19th, 75.

West Indies. Treaty Negotiated. HAVANA, 25.—Advices from San Domingo to the thirteenth, state that the preliminary negotiations for a treaty of amity and commerce between Spain and the Dominican republic have been successfully concluded; the principal clause provides for the perfect neutrality of San Domingo in all matters pertaining to Cuba. The treaty between Hayti and San Domingo is not yet signed.

Spain. Appointment. MADRID, 25.—Senor Menda has been appointed head of the financial administration in Cuba.

The Carlists. The Carlists attacked San Francisco last night, but were repulsed with heavy loss. The Carlists in force have again surrounded Irun, and are within five hundred yards of the walls; they opened a heavy fire to-day, to which the garrison replied.

Italy. Elected President. ROME, 25.—Signor Biancherio, a ministerial candidate, has been elected president of the chamber of deputies by a majority of 64.
