He was an advocate of true moral principles, and exerted his influence to disseminate the same on all occasions. His word was always to be relied on, never failing to meet his obligations, thus proving him to be a good practical Latter-day Saint.

The whole settlement sincerely condole with the bereaved family, and in doing this acknowledge the fact that they were all assiduous, persevering and attentive in his hours of sickness, as were his friends, relatives and the priesthood.

May his memory and his works be as a guiding star to those with whom his memory will ever remain and be cherished in their bosoms.
