A Jury Was Approached by a Friend of the Prisoner.

WITNESSES TO HAVE THE JURY.

Attempt to Establish an Alibi—Proceedings in the Trial Yesterday.

San Francisco, Oct.—After gathering up a ragged mass of testimony for two days last week, the jurors in the Durrant case this morning began the building of an alibi for the young man charged with the killing of the girl in April 1893, yesterday.

The case is to be heard by the jury in the District Court, and W. J. Durrant, who testified that on April 18, 1893, he was in the room with the girl, was called to the witness stand.

The first witness called this morning was a woman who was quite unexpected to the jury, and she testified that she was in the room with the girl on the night of the killing.

The court said that the witness had been called to the witness stand by the prosecution, and she was to be examined by the jury.
