THE PLEASANT GROVE DEBATE.

THE TRUTH VINDICATED .BY ELDER ANDREW JENSEN.

Last Saturday evening Elder Andrew Jenson, of Salt Lake City, accompanied some friends to a Josephite meeting held in Pleasant Grove, Utah County. After the services Mr. R. J. The challenge was accepted with the following question as e basis:

Do the revelations as contained in the Doctrine and Covenants (old edition) and the History of the Church up to the death of Joseph Smith, as published in the Times and Seasons and the Millennial Star, warrant the Saints in locating in the Rocky Mountains.

The following Monday evening was decided upon for the discussion, and at the appointed hour a large concourse of people assembled at Clark's Hall; hundreds, however, were unable to gain admission. Mr. Anthony, who is said to be an apostle in the Josephite Church, opened the debate by a speech of half an hour, followed by Andrew proofs. 1. That Joseph Smith, the Prophet, on August 6, 1842, prophesied that the Saints, after suffering much persecution, should be driven to the Rocky Mountains, and there become a mighty people, etc. 2. That Joseph Smith, in a large conference, held in Nauvoo, Illinois, in April, 1844, declared that the whole of North and South America was Zion. (That alone would warrant the Saints locating in the mountains.) 8. That Joseph Smith in February, 1884, organized an expedition to exview to the Saints locating there. 4. That Joseph Smith, when crossing the Mississippi river, June 22nd, 1844, to escape his enemies, intended to go Lord to do so.
