A RARE CASE. — This morning George Schleswien was before Justice Clinton for examination on a charge of committing a rape on a little girl 17 years and 6 months old, named Emily Peterson. The crime was alleged to have been committed in the prisoner's house, Commercial street, on Tuesday last. The evidence against the accused was of the dexterous character. Schleswien was bound over in \$3,000 to the Probate Court of Salt Lake County, and his default was committed to jail.

During the progress of the examination the Court Room was crowded to suffocation by a jury assembly of spectators. Outbursts of laughter and other manifestations of that sort were put to stop by the Court. It is a noticeable fact that cases of the most financial and disgusting details have the effect of drawing the largest crowds of on-lookers.

His eyes being very light blue, his eyebrows and eyelashes so light colored as to be scarcely perceptible at the distance of a few yards, and his face being totally devoid of hair, with the exception of an infinitesimal mustache he had a decided, if pugnacious look, even to the color and appearance of the skin.

The hearing over to the Probate Court of this individual presents another fine opportunity for Judge Hawley to culminate another attenuated and opaque opinion. There will doubtless soon be another *habeas corpus* case. Nothing like having a friend in court, no matter how great a rascal you are.
