In an essay lately read before the
Vermont Dairyman's Association Mr.
Alexander H. Mayhew has said that
the June produces a great flow of milk,

but the percent of water in it is much
above the average of 87. Take a cow
from a pasture and feed her on dry
hay and the quantity of milk will be

greatly diminished, while the quality
may be improved. Everything a cow
eats is reflected in the milk. There are
great faults in the milk as produced

abundance of rich milk, but unfortunately
the lady who presides over our
household has been misled by the
milk the least favor of either of

turnip. We have sometimes evaded
detection by feeding cabbage leaves
moderately at first and immediately
after milking, but the increased quantity

and quality of the milk, if not the taste,
are apt to call out the question, "What
are you feeding your cows on now?"
Sweet and rich, and of good confidence,

gives a richer milk than common corn,
Indian meal, all farmers agree, gives a
rich milk, while buckwheat increases
the per cent of water more rapidly

than it does the more valuable
properties. Clover, cut green, greatly
improves the quality of the milk. Being
a leguminous plant, it should add to its
