The spirit that is exalted in this confession is a very earnest and heavenly spirit, it produces pure happiness and excitement, and our hearts are filled with joy. There are the evidences of God's love; that He accepts of us and approves of our course. There has been a great deal of curiosity indulged by different members of the Church as to the spirit which the Lord has manifested recently. It is true that in the past the Lord has given, among other things, the gift of the ministering of angels, the gift of visions and dreams, and many people imagine that the Church is full of angels by the ministering of angels. Now, angels do minister unto men in our day, and we can testify to this. We can testify that Jesus, our Lord and King, has entered into the world as an incarnated unto men. We can testify to this from their personal experience. The Church is filled by the gift of revelation through the Holy Ghost. And now is a time to be free from God, that we can sometimes with power of voices fill the still small voice of the Spirit. It is shown by its fruits. Differences arise upon various matters, variations of views exist and are experienced. We are not to be divided, but to lead the people as men of independent thought and of positive character, as they do not cease without being convinced, but there is a way by which the truth and the right can always be known. Darkness is not one of the considerations of revelations from God; it is light—light which removes darkness and doubt from the human mind—that is the preference of God. It is the preference of God. If you have a revelation from God, if you read what the Prophet Joseph had revealed to him concerning Oliver Cowdery connected with the work of translation, you will get a key to the spirit of revelation that God has placed in His church. Just as Brother H. H. Roberts said this morning, the Lord told the church that they should receive the words of the prophets in their own hearts and minds." 
