THE COMMERCIAL BANK.

Its Officers Making an Effort to Arrange for Rescuing Business.

The Commercial National Bank may resume business in the near future, if the proposition made to the depositors of that institution is accepted. A circular has been sent to each interested party. The following is the first clause, which is addressed to "the depositors and those holding certificates of deposit." "The board of directors are taking steps towards the resumption of the business of the bank, and are desirous of having the depositors of the bank to be re-opened as soon as possible."

The plan is to have the stockholders make the capital stock good by paying up the amount of their stock. The depositors would then, at the opening of the bank, be paid twenty per cent of the amount due them and the balance in four installments of five per cent, starting in three, six, nine and twelve months, leaving six per cent interest. It is thought this proposition will be accepted and that the depositors will cooperate with the board of directors in placing the bank on a sound financial footing as soon as possible.
