To Rapid Transit People by the City Council Last Night.

MACCABEES CONSOLIDATED.

Ogden, March 29.—The ordinance granting to the Ogden Rapid Transit company a franchise for the extension of their line on Wall avenue, south of Twenty-fifth street, after several amendments had been made, was granted by the city council at its regular session last evening.

Amendments were made to sections Nos. 1 and 2. In the former the Rapid Transit company will not be allowed to operate interurban traffic within two miles of the city limits and not connect with any line that does. Cars must be run to the Salt Lake & Ogden railway crossing at Thirty-second street within six months from the granting of the franchise and at Thirty-fifth street as soon as the Salt Lake & Ogden road makes its permanent line. If these provisions are violated, the franchise becomes null and void.

The city engineer was instructed to publish notice of intention for the paving of Twenty-fourth street from Grand avenue to Wall avenue; Lincoln avenue from Twenty-fourth to Twenty-fifth streets; and Wall avenue from Twenty-fifth to Twenty-sixth streets. Judge V. C. Gunnell, in a communication, stated that two months ago he sent a letter to the council asking that some action be taken regarding the franchise on Sunday. He said that no action in the matter had been taken by the council, as it was due to the people.

On motion of Councilman Thomas the letter was read. Before this action was taken, President Browning asked that the committee to which Judge Gunnell's previous communication had been referred make some report.

GREAT BRITAIN'S NAVAL PROGRAM

By Strict Party Vote of 353 to 135 Commons Refused to Express Lack of Confidence.

DEBATE MOST MOMENTOUS

Its International Importance Was Signified by Vast Assemblage of Peers and Diplomats.

London, March 29.—By a strict party vote of 353 to 135 tonight the house of commons refused to express lack of confidence in the government's naval policy. The motion on which today's debate hinged was proposed by Arthur Hamilton Lee, Conservative member. It set forth "that in the opinion of this house the declared policy of his majesty's government respecting the immediate provisions for battleships of the newest type, does not sufficiently secure the safety of the empire."

The result was expected, but the debate was one of the most momentous the house has known for years. The assembly of diplomats and peers testified to its international importance. Leaders on both sides spoke. A. J. Balfour and Mr. Lee accused the cabinet of incompetence, and demanded that eight Dreadnoughts be laid down immediately. Premier Asquith and Sir Edward Grey, secretary for foreign affairs, repudiated their opponents for making a party question of the most vital matter of the country's foreign relations.

Grey's speech was by far the most notable contribution to the debate, because of its remarkable candor. He dealt on the political aspects of the British-German rivalry and the hopelessness of expecting any cessation of the race for armaments, and he predicted eventual European bankruptcy if it continued.

After his exposition of the government's policy, the speeches from the opposition benches seemed half-hearted, although flashes of enthusiasm were kindled among the opposition by the announcement while Mr. Balfour was speaking of the victory of the Conservatives in the Croxson election.

LEE'S MOTION.

Seldom in recent years has the national interest been so intensely focused on a debate in the house of commons as it was today when the opposition vote of censure on the government, with regard to the naval policy, was moved by Arthur Hamilton Lee, Conservative member from Hants. The text of the opposition motion is as follows:

"That in the opinion of this house the declared policy of his majesty's government respecting the immediate provision of battleships of the newest type does not sufficiently secure the safety of the empire."

Sir Edward Grey, the foreign secretary, did not attempt to minimize the seriousness of the situation created for Great Britain by the German naval program, which he declared meant that when Germany had completed this program she would have 33 Dreadnoughts, the most powerful fleet the world has ever seen, imposing upon the Great Britain the necessity of rebuilding her fleet entirely.

Sir Edward assured the house that the government had taken adequate steps to place British capabilities of construction beyond doubt. He then spoke of the progressive improvement of Anglo-German relations. The speech had a reassuring effect.

GRAY'S SPEECH.

Discussing the diplomatic aspects of the question, Sir Edward said naval expenditures had frequently been discussed by the two countries, always without success. Various arrangements were conceivable, for instance, a general agreement between the two nations to limit expenditures, or a comparison of estimates, each year in advance with a view to their modification.

There was apprehension in Germany that Great Britain was preparing to attack her, this he characterized as "a wild and absurd idea."

"The Germans," said the secretary, "view their program as one made for their own needs and one which has no reference to our program. Their idea is that if we build 30 Dreadnoughts, or a hundred, they would not build more than the number already decided upon, and if we cease

AMERICAN AND GERMAN WAGES COMPARED

Berlin, March 29.—The German foreign office, replying to a request from the state department at Washington for official information regarding wages and other costs in the production of 50 articles manufactured in Germany and covered by the American tariff, has drawn up a document which is now on its way to Washington.

The state department, after finding that the replies from American consuls to the circular note of last June on this subject were inadequate owing to the unwillingness of the French, British and German manufacturers to supply such rivals with facts upon which to base a tariff, directed the American ambassador in Europe to invite such information to the respective foreign offices. The foreign office contents itself with transmitting the official statistics from the countries concerned, together with a comparison prepared by the ministry of the interior of the wages actually paid in Germany and the figures paid as laid down in a tariff schedule of the American Congress by representatives of the industries affected by the American tariff.

It is in this comparison that the material for a sharp controversy has been found. It appears that one American industry reported wages in Germany in its line to be one quarter what it is actually in fact and various instances are cited of the submission to the ways and means committee of wage schedules of five and 10 years ago, when the cost of living was far less than now, as wages of today.
