Halifax, 10.—The steamer Nottinghill, New York April 1st for London, put in here after a terrible experience at rea. The two days following the hurricane prevailed The mizzen boom was torn down and dashed against the skylight and the engine room, through which the boom and glass fell, seriously injuring three engineers. All the doors of the deck houses burst; the rooms were gutted, the galley wrecked and a great part of the ship's provisions carried away; thirty-three feet of solid steel bulwarks were swept into the sea, and thirty feet of damaged stanchions torn from their fastenings as if scaffolding. Multitudinous seas drowned the fires and threaten. ed to overwhelm the ship. forty-eight hours she was still on her beam ends, and the pumps choked. The men kept bailing, but were only able to keep the water from gaining. Live stock in the hold were swimming about all this time and had no fodder. on Friday morning the men went in a body to Capt. Bennett, and de-manded to be taken into port or have the ship abandoned. The de-mand was impossible, the water in mand was impossible, the water in the engine room preventing the fires, and only two boats were left. On Friday night the weather mod-erated. On Saturday the storm subsided, and the ship being tight, the water was quickly reduced, steam raised, and as soon as the ship get under was abstract. Thirtygot under way she righted. Thirty-four bullocks and six sheep were lost, of 134 head of cattle and 199 sheep on board. About 100 tons of cargo were washed overboard.


