EXAMINATION IS DECLARED ILLEGAL

Supreme Court Holds Judge Can-
not Compel Person to Un-
dergo Indignity

WHEN PARTY TO A CIVIL SUIT

Case of Mrs. Jennie Larson Against
Salt Lake City et al Accordingly
Remanded to Court.

That a court has no authority to compel a person to undergo a physical examination, when such individual is a party to a civil suit, is the opinion of the supreme court of Utah, as defined in a decision rendered Saturday. The case had been that of Mrs. Jennie Larson against Salt Lake City, the Big Four Advertising Company, and James Riley, in which plaintiff sought to recover damages in the sum of \$3,000 for personal injuries alleged to have been inflicted upon her by a falling signboard near the Buffalo saloon, in 1907.

Defendants asked for an order of the court that would subject Mrs. Larson to the ordeal mentioned, and upon her refusal to comply with the requirement, the case was dismissed. Judge Straup, who wrote the supreme court's decision, says in part of the rulings of Michigan, courts, which formed the principal basis for Judge Lewis' action in the local court: "The very courts, which have admitted the existence of power to subject a person to a physical examination, assert with equal emphasis that an order of the court that a veterinary surgeon may be sent to examine a horse, whose condition is in dispute, is in excess of the power of the court. Why, then, in such a case, should a court compelling the plaintiff to allow a veterinary surgeon to enter his premises to make a physical examination, be considered as an unauthorized invasion of his rights, but to compel a plaintiff, especially a woman, to allow a physician, and a stranger, to examine her, whose condition is in dispute, is in excess of the power of the court. Why, then, in such a case, should a court compelling the plaintiff to allow a veterinary surgeon to enter his premises to make a physical examination, be considered as an unauthorized invasion of his rights?"

The case will be remanded to the district court, where it will be determined upon its merits, irrespective of whether or not plaintiff undergoes an examination.

DID NOT SUPPORT HER.
Rosella M. Dye has filed suit in the district court, asking that the bond of matrimony existing between herself and Joseph Dye be dissolved. Non-support forms the basis of the complaint. Mrs. Dye alleges that her husband has failed for more than a year to provide her with the necessities of life, although he is possessed of \$3,000 and is in receipt of good wages. The plaintiff requests, in addition to a divorce, to be permitted to have her children, and to be awarded \$1,500, which she claims as her just portion of Dye's property, which she has acquired by her own efforts.

SUIT ON NOTE.
The Mine & Smelter Supply Co. has filed suit in the district court against the Lulu Mining company, to recover the sum of \$80.00, alleged to be balance due on a certain promissory note, executed May 15, 1907.

Fourteen Boys and Fourteen Girls
Born During Past Week.
In the births recorded in this city for the past week, the number of boys was even as to sex—14 to 14. Deaths for the same period were much in excess of the record for several years past, but the number of females 15. Ten babies were shipped here for burial. Other features of vital statistics are as follows:

The week's reported deaths, the week 14 cases of contagious and infectious diseases, consisting of three cases of scarlet fever, seven cases of diphtheria, three cases of typhoid fever, and one case of chickenpox. Three houses on account of smallpox, three houses, scarlet fever, and one house, diphtheria, remain in quarantine at the end of the week.
