showed some falling off from the large

business of the two previous weeks,

but the trade has been good, the

sales comprising upwards of 2,000,000

with the exception of a small

demand for the present. There is no

change in the prices. All grades are

held firm, and holders are free

to sell at current rates. There is a

little more inquiry for fine fleeces and

a good demand for combed and

delaine fleeces. Pulled wools are

very quiet, the sales comprising: Ohio

Michigan 32 @ 35, Wisconsin, 35

New York, 31-1, heavy Vermont

X, 31, washed combed and delaine,
