Reduction on Coal Rates.

New York, June 15 .- As a result of New York, June 15.—As a result of the recent investigation by the inter-state commerce commission there is reason to believe, says the Herald, that a demand will be made for a reduction of freight rates on all anthracite coal. Should this course be adopted it is not believed that any recommendation will be made by the commission to the federal government for excise society. federal government for action against the coal roads on the ground that they had combined to restrain trade and came within the Sherman anti-trust

The commission in making a demand for the reduction of existing rates would act within its powers, but the railroads if they chose, could refuse to make the reduction and carry the case into the courts.

A reduction of rates would be of great benefit to the individual operat-ors in the Pennsylvaia anthracite field. It has been their contention for years that they were unable to mine coal at a profit on account of the high freight. The majority of the individual operators who are still in the field now sell their coal at the mines to the mines to the greater companies, receiving a propor-tion of the selling price of the coal at tidewater.
