

GOOD RACES AT SAUCEY TRACK.

In Match Between Collett and Hopper, Latter Was Defeated.

SAMUELSON'S GREAT RIDE.

Captured Three Mile Event in Championship Fashion—Amateur Events Were Hotly Contested.

The bicycle races at the saucy track last night will be numbered among the most interesting of the season. Every event, professional and amateur, was hotly contested, and each winner had to come to pull down the coin.

The match race between George Collett and N. C. Hopper was one of the prettiest ever seen on the famous old saucy track. Collett, who is a professional, and Hopper, who is an amateur, were both well matched, and the race was a close one. Collett won by a narrow margin, and the latter took his defeat rather sorely, and wanted to tie the easterner up for a return match for a side bet of \$100.

Seldom do we see two riders that are so evenly matched as this pair. The race was strictly on its merits, and kept the crowd on the edge of their seats until the very end. Hopper took the first heat, but it was nip and tuck from going to the second heat. The second heat was taken by Collett, who outgained Hopper about fifty yards from the wire and crossed over a winner by a close margin. In the third heat, Collett began a great sprint, two laps from home and beat Hopper by two lengths. The time for the heats follows: 2:25, 2:25, 2:25.

Collett made a mild protest against what he characterized as Hopper's unfair riding. He claimed that the pace maker was Hopper, and that the pace maker was not fair. AMERICAN DERBY NEXT SATURDAY.

Much Local Interest in the Great Annual Event at Chicago.

SOME PROBABLE STARTERS.

Greatest Horses in the Country Will Go to the Post for the Rich Purse Hung Up.

Salt Lake horsemen are greatly interested in the outcome of the American Derby, the leading turf event of America, which takes place at Chicago next Saturday afternoon.

There is only one turf event in the world in which there is more at stake, and in which more interest is centered, and that is the great Derby at Epsom Downs, England.

Saturday's event will be run at Washington park, and the scenes of former Derbies will be re-enacted, only upon a scale more elaborate and grand. Judging from the attendance at former Derbies, and the increasing interest in them, Saturday's great event will be witnessed by nearly 25,000 race fans.

There will be one class of track devotees who will be sadly disappointed. They are the bookies. No gambling will be permitted during the races. The mayor of Chicago has issued an edict against it, and this morning's dispatches state that the chief of police will have 300 officers on the track to see that the order is rigidly carried out.

His poor bookies can't earn a honest penny in the city that has gone up. But there will be quiet betting just the same.

The Derby is distinctly a society event, even as are the horse shows at the beginning of winter. Beautiful gowns and costumes, the array of drags, coaches, carriages, automobiles and other equipages, will present a wonderful picture in itself. Prior to the big race, there will be a parade of fashion along the principal streets of the Windy City, and this is a great show in itself.

Here in Salt Lake, if a purse of \$100 is hung up, we think it very generous. But what of the big Derby? The event is worth a fortune. \$250,000 is this time enough to bring the best 3-year olds in the United States together. What owner of a fast animal would not take a chance? They must be in the best possible condition for the race is hotly contested every inch of the way, and the winner is indeed king of the turf.
