Succession to the Presidency of the Senate and the possible ancession to the Presidency of the United States. — Clause 6, section 1, article 2 of the Constitution says— "In case of the removal of the President from office, or of his death, resignation, or inability to the said office, the same shall de-volve on the Vice President; and the Congress may by law provide for the case of removal, death, resignation, or inability, of both the President and Vice President; and the Congress may by law provide for the case of removal, death, resignation, or inability, of both the President and Vice President; and act as President, and such officer shall act accordingly, until the dis-ability be removed, or a President shall be elected."

The Act of Congress of March 1, 1792, says-

"In case of removal, death, resig-nation, or inability, both of the President and the Vice President of the United States, the President of the Benste pro tempore, and in case there shall be no President of the Senate, then the Speaker of the House of Representatives for the time being, shall act as Presi-dent of the United States until the disability be removed, or a President shall be elected."
