THE INDIAN TROUBLE

Reports from Daily's Ranch
Alarming Character.

DENVER, Dec. 17.—A special agent sent by the Indian Service from Rapid City, South Dakota, says: "I am about to reach a crisis here. Indians are seen in all directions westward of Rapid City, and at any moment, attacks are being made upon our settlements and they report seeing a lot of Indians, Scouts report that they have been killed and that the signal would indicate their life to the grass. They have been set fire for a number of ranches are burning. They may not attack for till night or to-morrow morning. Scouts report that several men have been killed on the same river. The Seventh cavalry will be sent against the Indians and make an attack on them." A decisive move is imperative. Squaw man reports 190 Indians moving toward our camp. We are strong, but having no food and can reach them with Hotchkiss guns. We are informed that we have reinforcements this afternoon and hope to get away before the company 2200 troops. Understood that General Carr has been laid off here for six weeks more than long.

PARNELL AT MILWAUKEE
