INTERNATIONAL TO INCREASE FORCES

Smelting Company Will be Employing In the Neighborhood of 600 Men Shortly.

With a force at present in the neighborhood of 400 to 500 men putting in the ballast for the railroad, excavating for the various buildings at the smelter site, building a station at Tooele and carrying in new steel, the present force of the International Smelting & Refining company will shortly be increased to something like 600 men.

At present a large gang is employed ballasting the tracks of the Tooele valley railroad. This work it is expected will take about a month to complete and then the company will have as well a built railroad as any in the country.

Another gang of men is at present erecting a pressed brick station and warehouse for the company at Tooele, as the steel addition to Tooele city is under way.
