WASHINGTON, 2.—The Speaker

announced that he had received a

letter from George W. Childs, pro-

prietor of the Philadelphia Ledger,

stating that the use of his name as

a proprietor in the bill to incor-

porate the International Immigra-

tion and Land Co. was wholly

unauthorized and without his con-

sent or knowledge; with the con-

sent of the House he directed

that the name be erased from the

bill. Similar statements were made

by Monroe as to Jacob D. Cox, of

Ohio, and by Burchard, as to Wil-

lie Flag, of Ill., and those names

were erased from the bill.
