The Departments of War, Interior and Justice accordingly united in ordering the marshal not to make the arrest. The Post-office Department whose employe was murdered, does not seem to have been invited to participate. At all events, Low Dog is comfortably corralled in government rations, and Sitting Bull still at large in Canada.

LOUISVILLE, 1.—Holney Hull was shot and instantly killed to-day at Cynthiana, Ky., by his brother-in-law Alexander Odor. Hull married Odor's sister, though she died ten years ago, the two men have had ill feeling towards each other all that time, growing out of a quarrel. The murder has the appearance of deliberation. Odor came to town armed with a double barreled shotgun loaded with buckshot. Finding Hull he called out to him, "are you ready," and fired. The first shot brought Hull to the ground and Odor deliberately fired another barrel into his head tearing it into a frightful mass.

BRIEF TELEGRAMS.

Dorsey, of Star route fame, is quite ill from mental excitement.

Immigration for May exceeds the figures for the same month last year by 21,000.

Conceur's car works, at Coburg, were partially burned this morning. Loss \$40,000.

Clifford Lloyd, chief magistrate at Killmuck, is creating disturbance by his brutality.

Dillon has written a letter to the speaker of the Commons complaining of his detention.

The murderers of Seguin, a correspondent of the Paris Telegram, have been shot at Tunis.

An unusual number of detectives watched those who entered the land league office in Dublin to-day.

One Barony in County Meath and three parishes in Donegal, are proclaimed under the coercion act.

Midhat Pasha declares the story of the murder of Abdul Aziz false and says Abdul committed suicide.

Sitting Bull, with 35 lodges, is at Fort Quappelle, Manitoba, awaiting the arrival of Major Walsh from Canada.

The Anchor line steamer Macedonia, ashore near the Mull of Kintyre light-house, has been abandoned, being full of water.

The Duke of Athol left Montreal to-day for Lake George. He intends to return in a few days, and will then proceed to California.

Greece wants De Lesseps to construct a canal through the Isthmus of Corinth, to connect the Gulf of Corinth with the Aegean sea.

The new Union depot, Denver, costing \$200,000, is completed, and from and after to-morrow, all trains will arrive and depart from it.

Gladstone will hand over the Chancellorship of the Exchequer to Mr. Childers, and Goschen will succeed the latter as secretary of war.

The American ship Geo. Peabody, Captain Lawrence, from New York, May 23d, for San Francisco, put into Valparaiso, May 30th, leaking badly.

John Riley, in St. Catharines, Ont., has confessed to being of the party who committed the outrage on the girl Potter, which resulted in her death.

Pitney, custodian of the treasury gave a receipt for \$2,000, three years ago, for waste paper, and made no entry on his books, but says the cash is in his safe.

A number of the county constabulary officers and magistrates, interviewed Chief Secretary Forster to-day, when the state of their districts was fully discussed.

At a meeting of the land league to-day, Sexton said he had visited Dillon and regretted to find his delicate condition was seriously affected by his incarceration.

Mythias, a civil engineer of the Denver and Rio Grande, about the 25th of April, was impounded at the head of the Roaring Forks, Gunnison County, Colorado, by snow and high water. A relief party was sent from Leadville, which returned to-day, rescuing Mythias and party. They found the sufferers last Monday afternoon, very weak, having had nothing to eat but fresh meat for 31 days.

Senator Ferry has arrived at Detroit, in charge of a physician. His health was much affected by the importunities of office-seekers and the duties of the extra session.

M. Zeguine, correspondent of the Paris Telegraph, was killed by Arabs on Saturday last, at Beja, Tunis. He was felled to the earth by stones and stabbed in eight places.

Stephen Massett has just issued two ballads, "The dying boy's prayer," dedicated to Sam Ward, the words by a London poet, Austin Dobson, the other "My darling's shoes."

Citizens of Chattanooga, Tenn., are arranging for a meeting of the army of the Cumberland on Sept. 2d. President Garfield, Secretary Lincoln and other cabinet officers will be there.

There was a riot to-day at Clonmel, at the sale of tenants' interests in twenty-one farms. The mob stoned the police and soldiery. The police charged once and the Hussars several times.

A Greek decree has been signed granting De Lesseps a concession to cut a canal through the Isthmus of Corinth. Work will probably be commenced in 1882, and will be completed in five years.
