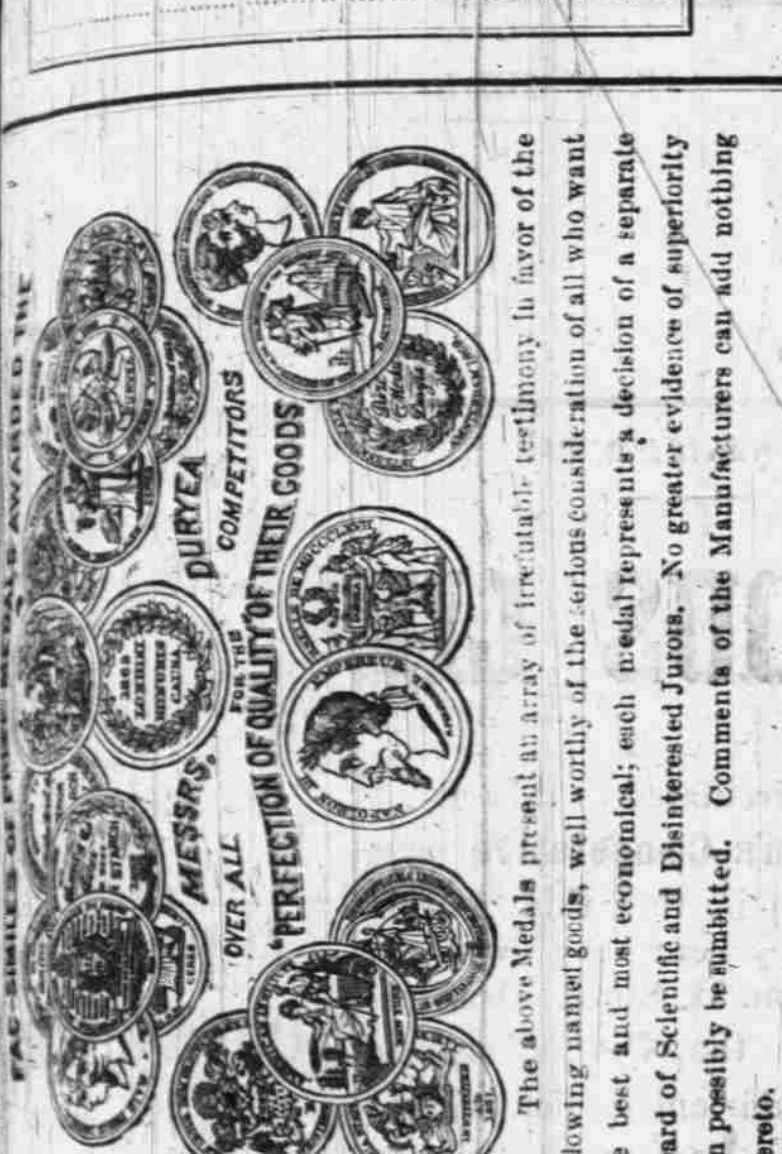

WASHINGTON, 15.—The store of
Friedrich Magruder, at Benning's
Station, near Washington, was burned this
morning, and Ebenezer Large, and

building, were burned to death.
There is but little doubt that both
of the men were murdered, the
store robbed and then set on fire.

Universal Notification.

MEMPHIS, 15.—There is universal
satisfaction at the nomination
of General A. J. Vaughn as post-
master here. He was the choice of
the citizens when Tilden was be-
lieved to be elected. He lost a leg
in the Confederate army.

Wholesale Slaughter of Chinamen.

SAN FRANCISCO, 15.—Last night
six Chinamen employed in clear-
ing land near Chico, Butte County,
were attacked in their cabin by a
gang of whites, and three of them
were shot dead; the fourth died
soon after the fifth is lying be-
yond hope of recovery, and the
sixth, who was slightly wounded,
escaped by feigning death. He
says, after finishing the work the
murderers set the cabin on fire and
fled. He extinguished the flames
and gave the alarm. The murder
was in cold blood and unprovoked.
There is no clue to the assassins. A
number of crimes of violence have
been recently perpetrated on Chin-
amen in the neighborhood, and but
little exertion has been made to
discover the offenders, but this
growing outrage has aroused the
citizens, and steps are being taken
to discover and punish the mur-
derers.

FOREIGN.

GERMANY.

Bismarck's Health Declining.
BERLIN, 15.—In each of Prince
Bismarck's recent "important
speeches in the Reichstag, he de-
clared that his health was giving
way under the strain of his position
in a great measure by endless an-
tagonism. To prove how insuffi-
ciently he is supported by individual
ministers, he cited the case of Gen.
Von Stosch, Chief of the Admiralty,
who last session, forced on him a
long and intricate correspondence
about the admiralty estimates,
which he (Bismarck) desired to be
reduced, but when the estimates
came up, the Reichstag refused to
reduce them, and the result was the
dismissal of the Liberal members,
without discussion. In consequence
of Prince Bismarck reviewing this
incident, Von Stosch resigned.
The deficit in the budget is \$5,
000,000.

General Amnesty in Bulgaria, etc.

The Sultan has proclaimed a gen-
eral amnesty in Bulgaria.
The English answer Russia's
proposal to extend to occasion
further negotiations of a friendly
and pacific character.

Turkey and Montenegro's Demands.

A special dated Pers 15th, says
Savret Pasha, to-day, informed the
Montenegrin delegates that he re-
gretted that Turkey was unable to
agree to their demands, but added
that he was anxious to continue
the discussion of the basis for peace.
The delegates replied that they
were unable to accept this proposal,
their country was not prepared to
limit and limited, and that they must
therefore communicate the Porte's
decision immediately to their gov-
ernment. It is said the delegates
will wait for the answer of the
Porte, which is expected to be com-
municated before leaving Constantinople.

FRANCE.

General Ignatieff Will Visit
Russia.
PARIS, 15.—A Paris correspond-
ent reports that General Ignatieff
will go to England on the invita-
tion of Lord Salisbury, who has
asked him to visit his country resi-
dence. The object of Ignatieff's
journey is to second Count Schou-
valoff's efforts to arrive at an un-
derstanding. The differences now are
merely verbal. It seems impossible
that the object of Ignatieff's
journey could miscarry, after having
reached this point.

TURKEY.

Agitation at the Death of Michael
Fasch.
CONSTANTINOPLE, 15.—Great agi-
tation prevails at the death of Mi-
chael Fasch, and war with Russia
seems imminent. Among the con-
fused demands of the populace
grave complications are appre-
hended.

GREAT BRITAIN.

Elliot to Return to Constantinople.
LONDON, 15.—The Standard, this
evening, announces officially that
Elliot will very shortly assume his
duties as ambassador to Great
Britain to Constantinople, and that
it is probable Elliot's return will
be followed by that of the ambas-
sadors of the other great powers.

A Peaceful Solution Looked For.

A St. Petersburg correspondent
telegraphs: Although the war party
is still in a dominant position, offi-
cially informed that a peaceful solu-
tion is scarcely doubtful. The only
question between Russia and Eng-
land now is whether Russia or Tur-
key shall disarm first.
