An Editor Shot.

Stephen S. Jones, editor of the Religio - Philosphical Journal, 127 Fourth Avenue, was shot dead in his office this afternoon, by W. C. Pike, who immediately gave himself up. Pike and his wife have been rooming in Jones' building this winter without paying rent, and it is surmised that this may have caused the trouble. Pike alleged as the reason for the killing that Jones seduced his wife, and he produced a confession signed by his wife to that effect. Mrs. Pike confirms her husband's story, but the friends of the deceased declare, that he was incapable of the alleged crime. All the parties involved are spiritualists, and the affair causes considerable excitement. Pike was held this afternoon, without bail, to the criminal court.

The Republicans Discouraged at the Louisiana Prospects.

The Tribunc's Washington says the Southern republicans, to-night, are much discouraged. Marcy and Smith, the Louisiana representa-tives, are willing to concede no-thing except that the result of the President's proposed policy will be the abandonment of the republican party South, and say if the troops are withdrawn and Packard is not recognized affirmatively, the next election in Louisiana will be 80,000 democratic, and the republican votes and organization will entirely disappear.
