If he has offended against the laws of war he should have such trial and punishment as the laws require. A spy, though a prisoner of war, may be tried, condemned and executed by a military tribunal without a breach of the constitu-

without a breach of the constitution. A bushwhacker, jayhawker, bandit of war, rebel or assassin, be-ing public enemies, may be tried, condemned and executed as offenders against the laws of war. The law of nations, which is the result of the experience and wisdom of ages, has decided that jayhawkers, bandits, &c., are offenders against the law of nations and of war, and as such are amenable to the military. Our constitution has made those laws part of the law of the land."
