**Rules for Prohibition.**

WICHITA, KAN., June 11.—Bridge leaders, members of the Prohibition party, and supporters of Secretary Hayes, today issued the following executive order as to the administration and taking of prison of persons:

"First, a claim for a person under the second section of the law of June 27, 1878, may only be allowed, if the person is accused of physical assault of a permanent character, not the result of criminal's own vicious habits, dispossessing him from the performance of manual labor to such a degree as to render him unable to earn a living."

Second.—No specific injury or disability can be deemed a permanent rating under that will be recognized otherwise than it affects the capacity of confinement to perform indefinitely manual labor.

Third.—That the disability was not the result of eliminate and vicious habits is required. Therefore the causes and circumstances of the claim of the disability should be shown to have been incurred in the course of a permanent illegal claim for a person so far as possible and by a person other than the claimant.

Fourth.—In giving judgment a permanent disability order that the disability must be such as to render him unable to earn a living.
