

**STOREY IS CAUGHT.**

He Laid Out in the Brush Northwest of the Town All Night.

AND SO DID A DEPUTY SHERIFF

Was Nailed His Man at 1 a.m. Today.—They Had Been Only Ten Feet Apart for Hours.

**James Storey** is in the custody of Sheriff Hurlow on the accusation of having committed a felony. The complaint was filed with U. S. Commissioner Summer yesterday, and Storey was captured at 4 o'clock this morning, six miles northwest of the city. My professor to know nothing of the alleged offense. Mrs. Storey has been a criminal assault upon Storey and his husband, John Green, has been out Saturday night, and never arrived at Green's home first. No, not until he was taken before Judge Hurlow, and held for his appearance tomorrow fixed at \$500, in default of which he remains in the sheriff's custody.

The deputies detailed to serve the warrant of arrest, however, had quite a time in accomplishing their task. Deputy Sheriff Gubler and Thomas were sent out on the business, and for a time could not trace the person they wanted. As fast as they learned that Storey and an associate had left the city, however, they expected that Robinson would come to town, so laid wait for him. Late night they were rewarded by meeting Robinson, of whom they inquired Storey's whereabouts. They failed to find the desired information, so Hurlow and his men went on the charge of aiding a felon to escape. After a while, Hurlow, weakened at the prospect of alarm in jail, and admitted that his Storey had spent the night in the city. Thereupon, after further pressure, and was compelled to lead the officers to where he had left Storey, for whom he had come in to get some clothes and supplies.

The two officers and Robinson started out again, and were soon successful in their search. Mr. Gubler went along a dry creek to a boat where Robinson said the missing man and himself had spent most of the day, and took up position there. It was late at night, but the officers succeeded in getting him to leave the boat, and he was soon led to the Union Union railway at Salt Lake, where he was given a ticket to a train.

At 4 o'clock this morning, however, Deputy Sheriff Gubler was rewarded by discovering, notwithstanding his best efforts, that the object of his search, Storey, had been captured at 4 o'clock this morning, close to the office—so close that he dare not make a move to escape, and in a position that the approaching daylight revealed his whereabouts. He was brought to the office, and Mr. Green, who had directed the search for Storey, was called to many times by Hurlow, who stated that he may be well informed himself, as the officers would be glad to get him, but there was no expense.
