LOCK WATCHMAN IN CLOSET Then Blow Open the Safe and Secure \$752.40 in Cash And Decamp.

Henry Oliver Found Locked Up When Engineer Goes to Work—Coolest Crime Yet. Two armed and masked robbers entered the Royal laundry building, 625 South State street, shortly after 12:30 this morning, held up Watchman Henry Oliver, locked him in a closet, and then blew open the safe, secured \$752.40 in cash and escaped.

MARCHED INTO CLOSET. The robbers gained entrance through a side door. They heard Watchman Oliver sweeping on the second floor and he heard the men enter. He started down stairs but before reaching the bottom was confronted by two heavily built men wearing black masks and armed with big revolvers.

SWEEPING ON SECOND FLOOR. "I was on the second floor sweeping," said Watchman Oliver to the news. "I heard the men downstairs and started to go down. I got to within four or five steps of the bottom when the robbers shoved guns in my face and compelled me to walk to the closet where they locked me up."
