bor has just issued a bulletin prepared [ by S. E. Foreman, in which the conditions of the poor as regards the methods and cost of living are very interestingly set forth. As the basis of this report the conditions in which 19 famlies were existing were investigated. Incomes from which these families subsisted were from \$20 a month, upon which a widow provided for herself and six children, to varying incomes of \$9 to \$13 a week for the heads of families

From such incomes it was necessary to pay rent and provide food, fuel and clothing, and in the tables that accom-pany the report it is shown that the cost of food for these families varied from \$2.85 to \$8.65 a week, reaching \$8.65 only in cases where some of the children had reached an earning power. In the bulletin are found some interesting deductions that are held to be generally true:

1. That all husbands consume a like amount of food.

2. That the wife consumes 90 per cent

much food as the husband. 5 That a child from four to six years of age, inclusive, consumes 40 per cent as much food as the husband. 6. That a child thre years of age or

under consumes 15 per cent as much food as the husband. For the living of these families nearly 60 per cent of the total living expenses were confined to the purchase of bread and meat alone, the bread being

bought from the bakery generally at 5 cents a loaf, because of the necessity of so much fuel to do the baking at More than balf the families home. made use of stale bread at a cost of

the families made no purchase of eggs whatever, and numerous weeks passed in some of the families when no but-ter whatever was made use of, while the total expenditure of 16 families for fruit was \$8.09. In making up this comparison of the cost of methods of living among the poor all families where intoxicants in the form of beer or whisky were used were carefully avoided, so that the expenditure might show the autual conditions under which poor families lived when the income was carefully and actually existed for the necessaries of life.
