Washington, Sept. 1.—Morrow said the Senate amendment to the treaty submitted by the President was vital and without it the treaty would be ineffective. The amendment caused the rejection of the treaty by the Chinese government, yet it was inserted to meet the demand of the Chinese government, and the amendment was in the very language of that part of the decision which pointed out the stipulation necessary to exclude Chinese immigrants from the United States.

Morrow added, if the news of the rejection of the treaty should be confirmed, the Chinese government would ask Congress to pass a bill requesting the President to give six months to the Chinese government to consider the United States' position, and that notice would amount to a revocation of all asserted rights of the Chinese to enter the country.

Agent Jones has called for military assistance and ordered the garrison at Fort Washakie to prepare for an attack. The settlers also are making active preparations for their defense.

St. Paul, Sept. 1.—The Crow Creek Indians did not hold a council last night, says the *Flower Press* special, but spent the night on a still hunt for trout against the treaty. The opposition here mostly comes from a few Indians who have acquired considerable live stock, and who fear their grazing grounds will be curtailed if the treaty is made. The commissioners devoted yesterday to personal interviews with the leaders of the opposition. Chairman Pratt has been presented with a brief by the Indians, asking remuneration of seventy-five acres of land which the Northwestern look for in the Pierre extension, and for a transfer of a number of this tribe from the reservation back to Crow Creek.

He informed Chief White Ghost that he would submit these requests to the government at once, at which the chief expressed great satisfaction. He said the other Indians. A favorable decision on these two points will greatly promote the ratification of the treaty here.

The American Party.
New York, Sept. 1.—The American party which called a convention at Washington August 14, and nominated Gen. James L. Curtis, of New York, for President, has established headquarters at 731 Broadway, and tonight issued an address calling upon the "true lovers of our country, be they native or foreign born, to place themselves in connection with the executive committee."

An appeal is made to the American people to show that they are not a "race of ignorant voters" by manifesting their support of the American political bosses.

Speech by Flouquet.
Paris, Sept. 1.—The municipal authorities of Toulon entertained Prime Minister Flouquet at lunch yesterday. In a speech the premier urged upon his hearers the danger of allowing the quiet of the republic to be disturbed by open attempts at dictatorship. No government, he said, could be maintained by force of arms, and everything that it wished to accomplish it wished to accomplish by the consent of the people. The speaker was greeted with a shout of approval by his hearers.

The maritime prefect afterwards delivered an address assuring Mr. Flouquet of the loyalty of the navy.

An Eviction.
DUBLIN, Sept. 1.—Lord Clanciarde's evictors today attacked the house of a tenant named Tully at Clonca, facing Shannon. A deep trench had been dug around the house, and the house had been banked to the roof with clay, stones and debris.

The evictors advanced with a battering ram, and the house was being battered by the defenders, who fired volleys of stones and poured down from the roof a shower of missiles, compelling them to retreat. Some of the evictors were wounded, and the house was set on fire.

The police succeeded in taking possession of the house and capturing the occupants.

Magnificent Garden Party.
SARATOGA, N. Y., Sept. 1.—The Grand Union Hotel garden party which took place this afternoon and tonight was attended by from 6,000 to 8,000 people.

The display of magnificent costumes and diamonds excelled anything ever seen here. Among those present were representatives from every section of the United States and Canada.

The grounds were gorgeously decorated with flags, banners, coats of arms and drawings. Electric light towers and lanterns made the scene a most brilliant one. Are lights flashing from the towers, and all the time added to the general picturesque quality of the scene.

The garden party was the grandest affair ever given in Saratoga.

A Case Appears in Philadelphia.
WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—Surgeon-General Hamilton has just received a dispatch from Philadelphia informing him that a case of yellow fever has been discovered there in the person of a Florida refugee who passed inspection at Waycross, Georgia. The patient was sent to the municipal hospital.

Governor Perry of Florida, telegraphed to Surgeon-General Hamilton as follows: "Without the consent of the Nassau county board of health, I have sent a patient to the municipal hospital there, asked by the Jacksonville committee."
