GREAT BOON FOR OAKLEY CITIZENS

Vast Irrigation Scheme Assumes Definite Shape With Capital Secured.

LAND ONLY AWAITS WATER

Prest. W. T. Jack of Casita State declares Region is One of the Most Fertile in Idaho.

Among the citizens in this city is President William T. Jack of Casita state, Idaho. President Jack is much enthused with the promise of a vast irrigation enterprise for Oakley, in speaking of which he said today:

"Today marks the greatest epoch in the material interests of Casita county in general and of Oakley in particular. After years of waiting and hoping for some company or individual to come with money and mind to erect a system of reservoirs with which to store the waters of the Goose creek and make habitable the thousands of fertile acres lying to the north of our prosperous village, the deliverer came today in the person of W. S. Kuhn of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania...

IN OTHER SYSTEMS.

"Mr. Kuhn, who is the financial backer of the Twin Falls North Side Land & Water Co., had been at Jerome on April 1, attending the ceremonies which were held at the turning of the water into the north side canal system, and before proceeding to the Salmon river project, about to be commenced, and which will open up 18,000 acres of land, he apparently some citizen in that part of the city became tired of having flower gardens destroyed and peach trees gnawed with and taking the law into his own hand, put a stop to the assistance."

MET BY BRASS BAND.

"At Oakley the party was met by the brass band and several hundred people who had gathered to do honor to the visitors. After luncheon the visitors responded to the greetings of the assembled populace with impromptu addresses as follows: Henry H. Kuhn, president of the Casita State, Secretary of the State, Mr. Kuhn, Gen. McDougal, Secy. Lansdown and Mr. Austin, all speaking in highest praise of the splendid lands in the beautiful valley of Goose creek. The governor, likewise, being introduced by the land board present pledged themselves to do all in their power to assist in the opening of settlement of the broad acres of fertile land north and west of our settlement, and Mr. Kuhn, in return, pledged to construct a line of railroad to Oakley and erect the reservoir inside of 18 months. So that with the signing of the papers with Mr. Kuhn and the state land board, all preliminary matters being settled, the work of actual construction will begin in due time.

"The people of Oakley feel that much credit is due Gov. Brady for the valuable assistance rendered him by his influence in bringing Mr. Kuhn and the citizens of this valley together whereby this condition was reached.
