In his last circular letter, Henry Clews says: "The only thing that makes securi-ties look cheap just now is cheap money, which combined with hopeful-ness are the main factors in support of the stock market. What stocks may do when interest rates advance, as they must with the increasing demand for mercantile credits, cannot be predicted at this time; bui it is evident that tha lifting power of cheap money cannot be relied upon indefinitely, and it must be realized that this support will gralifting power of cheap money cannot be relied upon indefinitely, and it must be realized that this support will gra-dually disappear as business improves Just now money is plentiful and cheap It must also be recognized that the foating supply of stocks has been largely concentrated in a few hands ever since the panic, and that the hold-ers of these accumulations are anxious to take their profits and lighten their load. This they will do on every favor-able opportunity. On the other hand the general situation is very satisfac-tory. All the known forces are to-wards recuperation. As a result of recent house cleaning the financial situation is exceptionally sound; and there is nothing in sight to prevent an unusually prompt return of business to the normal, at least in volume if not in profit. Our railroads are east-ceptionally well situated; some croak-ing managers to the contrary. Manila, Nov. 12 .- Manila's new water Manila, Nov, 12.—Manila's new what system, constructed during a period of three years at an outlay of \$2,000,000, is completed. The water was let loose this afternoon at the source of supply in the Marulna valley and sent coursing the invitation of the municipal authori-ties, Gov. Gen. Smith turned the wheels which operate the dam gates and for the first time the mains in the city's streets were filled from the new supply In its 20-mile journey from the high-er altitudes the water is carried part of the distance through a steel pipe line and the remainder of the way in a oncrete conduit.
