The U.S. correspondent of the Chicago Live Stock Report says: "There will be less cattle already to market during 1897 than for many years past. During the winter and spring months from Colorado, Nebraska and Kansas have been buying and shipping stock cattle. Then again many young cattle have been contracted to go to Wyoming, Montana and other northern states, leaving the supply for fall movement very short. These cattle have been bringing good prices, and the Utah stockmen have been benefited accordingly. The decrease in the number of cattle in the favorable season and the new land law will this year do a great deal to increase the supply of cattle. Large sections will be reserved this year and the result will be better cattle during the year to come. They will be better than usual; the land crop is more than average, and the owners are correspondingly happy. Utah sheep are famous, and this year we think the movement from the state will be the largest for many years. There are a great many thousands now on the trail going to Kansas and Nebraska for winter feed. Oregon and Idaho are sending out a larger number than usual, and it is believed that there is a possibility of sending cattle the granger can secure plenty of properly bred sheep for his feed lot. Sheep and lambs will come more to market early, and in July the call for double-quick ones will come. Many of the Utah sheep shippers are going to avail themselves of the new lower market and improved shipping arrangements at Denver, and they will raise their sheep accordingly. They have always wished for a sheep market somewhere west of the Missouri river and they have their wish gratified."
