Little Mabel Fowler Meets Death in  
Eight Inches of Water

#### DROWNED WHILE AT PEAK

A Lively and Frolicsome Child  
Dies this Morning, a Corpse

Hudson entered the home of Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Fowler at No. 454 north Second Street this morning. Their eighteen-month-old child, Mabel Ivy, was allowed to go outside of the house at 9:30 o'clock. She was accompanied by an older child who subsequently left the little girl to herself for a minute or two. The mother of the baby stopped to get some laundry from her neighbor's door and later to look for it. Finding it gone she called it by name, but getting no response, instinctively ran to the west end of the lot where a stream of water was spouting against

Mrs. Fowler was horrified at finding her darling in this way. It had fallen to her local informant. She asked it to be buried and the informant promised her assistance. Neighbors were notified immediately and Dr. Caldwell was summoned forthwith. He promptly responded and for nearly an hour applied his skill to the child's body. He pronounced that all he could do was to inhale the already given stricken mother that her child would live.
