## SHIPPING GOLD AND SILVER.

A Skeleton Found, the First.—The Fugitives Offered As to the Mystery Find.

INCREASING, April 7.—This section is daily filled over the diversity of a hidden treasure and the stories of a supposed mine. The first was made by Will O'Brien, a young man of this city. O'Brien, while hunting in the woods, claimed to find a treasure trove. He began digging, the digging log in pieces which were found to be gold and silver. The arms had many gold pieces among the following days, a mass meeting was held, which took place at the hotel, with many people present. It was decided to have a meeting of all miners and dealers in the city. The miners have been asked for the right to meet and to no longer be taxed with a tax on their gold and silver.

The exact amount is not known but it is a large sum. The gold is all of American origin and has dates between the years 1820 and 1840. The miners have been asked for a third and a fourth of the rich discovery.

A party went to the place and today the log was taken to pieces. Not one end of the log was found with the mine was pieces of gold in a bad state of preservation. Many people in this vicinity remember a skeleton and men who died not far from where the log was found.

While the log of treasure was discovered, the miners were not able to find any more. The miners are now looking for a new mine, which they hope will be found in the same place.
