INCREASED DEMAND.

Reports from Two British Woolen Manufacturers.

THE CONDITION AND PROSPECTS.

Part of the Reports Speak of Some Improvement—Iron and Steel Demand Has Increased.

Mr. Lott, Min., Jan. 8.—The Age of Steel of this date contains reports from some 20 leading manufacturers of iron and steel, hardware, machinery and railway rolling stock as to the condition of their business since midwinter, the proportion of steel to the total, and the extent and significance of the prospects for 1895. The tone of the reports is cheery, though the reports speak of some measure of improvement in the conditions and prospects, and where the gains in business are explicitly stated, they are generally small, and the reports are not so general and comprehensive as those in the previous issue. The Central Pacific officials point to a continuation of the continuity.
