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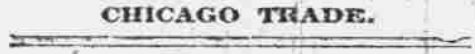
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THE MOMENTOUS QUESTION

The Bill Discussed by Several

Senators.

BUT NO VOTE IS REACHED YET.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10.—The Senate

at one o'clock p. m. took up the

state commerce bill, and Beck took

the floor with a speech in favor of

the conference report.

On motion of Dawes, the House

amendments to the Senate bill, to

provide for the construction of a

new line of railroads, were not

conferred in and a conference

was called.

At two o'clock, Beck having

concluded his speech on the

inter-state commerce bill,

Cullom took the floor. He said he

had no objection to the bill, and

in a long speech he explained the

bill in detail, and showed that it

was a measure of great importance

to the country.

He then read the bill, and

concluded his speech.

The bill was then referred to the

committee on commerce.

The bill was then taken up for

discussion.

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
