CONGRESSIONAL

HOUSE.

WASHINGTON, 13.—The House

went into committee of the whole

on the Postoffice appropriation bill.

The appropriation recommended is

\$33,100,000, a reduction of \$987,770

from last year; \$9,100,000 of that

sum is for railroad mail service, \$9,

000,000 for inland mail transportation,

and \$17,500,000 for pay of post-

masters. The bill provides that the

Postmaster General may appoint

one agent to superintend the

railroad postal service, and one to

superintend the Star service, and

authorizes the Postmaster General

to reduce the compensation of rail-

roads for the transportation of mails

5 per cent.

A long and general debate was

interrupted by the committee ring-

ing, and soon afterwards the House

adjourned.

The Gold Premium Declines.

NEW YORK, 13.—The day in

Wall Street has been remarkable

for buoyancy in stocks and the vir-

tual strengthening of the gold

premium, which declined to 1, the

lowest point touched since the pre-

mium began, seven years ago.

PHILADELPHIA, 13.—Judge

Mitchell, to-day, overruled the

motion for a new trial in the case of

Stroffes Pistorius, convicted of the

murder of Isaac Jacobus, in Mont-

gomery county, Pa., 1876, and sen-

tenced to be hanged. Upon the an-

nuouncement, Pistorius arose ex-

citedly and accused his lawyers of

not having acted in good faith, and

said if the court did not grant him a

new trial, he would be a

murderer of justice. Counsel for

Pistorius gave notice that the case

would be carried to the Supreme

Court.

Practicability of Resumption.

CHICAGO, 13.—The practicability

of resumption has been instanced

here in various ways, to-day, at the

sub-committee. A twenty-dollar

gold piece came in to be exchanged

for currency and three coin checks,

issued by the Collector of Customs

were deposited by the bank as cur-
