PER WESTERN UNION TELEGRAPH LINE. LAST NIGHT'S DISPATCHES EASTERN.

Discrepancies Discovered. NEW YORK, 6 .- The Tribune tomorrow, says it is rumored on Wall Street that the Pacific Mail Comoany has discovered discrepancie in its accounts at San Francisco and Hongkong, which will reduce the finances some \$378,000 below the estimates.

More Fraud-Appointments. WASHINGTON, 6. — Conclusive proof has been obtained that four or five clerks in the Post-office Department, and several persons outside, have secured a number of contracts for mail service in the South-western States by means of a counterfeit stamp containing the initials of the first and second postmasters general, which is placed on the bids when opened in order to show that they have been received in time; this counterfeit stamp has been used to give validity to straw bids made at lower figures than the lowest of the bids really opened at the advertised time. Among the contractors implicated is ex-Congressman Haynes, recently appointed U.S. Marshal for Alabama.
The contracts thus secured will be annulled, and all the clerks impli-

cated immediately dismissed.

London, 8.—The budget about to be presented by the chancellor of the exchequer to parliament will give the following exhibit of the finances for the fiscal year ending March 31st, '75: total revenue from all sources £74,922,000, being an excess over the estimates of £497,000; total expenditures, £74,328,000; less than estimated, £888,000; the reduction of expenses and the excess of receipts gives the government a surplus of £1,183,000.
