BUSINESS IS PROCRESSING.

It is Along Conservative Lines and Without Excitement.

NO SPECULATIVE ACTIVITY

To Any Extent-Undertone is Confident-Prices of Commodifies are Generally Steady.

New York, Dec. 7,--R. G. Dun & Co.'s Weekly Review of Trade will say tomorrow; "Business is progressing along conservative lines. It is without excitement and without great speculative activity, but with a confident undertone which is to be explained largely by the fact that leading concerns in most of the great industries have orders booked to employ their machinery at nearly full capacity during months when curtailment was ing months when curtainent was usual. No net reduction in working forde has appeared in the last fort-night, and a readjustment of wage schedules in some branches of the steel schedules in some branches of the steel trade is affected without trouble. Prices of commodities are generally steady, and holiday trade is brisk at all points. The South is particularly cheerful with cotton and the rice crop ming in at very full prices. There is no cause for alarm in the

small volume of new business at iron and steel centers. With the first sign of higher prices there came forward such a food of contracts that mills and of intervals of contracts that mills and such a flood of contracts that mills and furnaces booked orders sufficient to keep the full force employed for months. Hence there has come a more quiet condition, with less bidding for products. Fortunately quotations were not forced up unreasonably dur-ing the week's greatest activity, and now there is no sign of depression. On the other hand bars are more firmly held, while many idle mills have re-sumed in this department, and sheet-makers also insist on better terms. makers also insist on better terms. "Other forms of finished material are

HERD OF BUFFALO FOR SALE

The DuPree Bunch in South Dakota to be Disposed of in a Bunch if Possible.

A herd of full blooded buffalos is one of the curlosities of the country today. There are not a half dosen hords of any size in the country out of the millions

alze in the country out of the millions that once roamed the western plains. This herd was a part of the DuPree es-tate and Dr. F. Carlin of Fort Pierre is now trying to dispose of them. This herd of full blood buffalos com-prise forty-five head and is the larg-est in the world. The nucleus of the herd was captured near Slim Eutres in 1882. Since that time they have never been confined but have ranged at will with other cattle along the Cheyenne river. Mr. Carlin hopes that the gen-eral government will take steps to se-cure the herd and place it in the Yel-lowstone Park, or elsewhere that it may be developed into a considerable herd. If sold to individuals here and there If sold to individuals here and there and taken off their native range they coon be lost sight of entirely. ase no such steps are taken, perhaps some syndicate or individal might buy the entire bunch and arrange to de-velop a herd here, as it is a rare oportunity to make some money from a mail investment.
