

DESPERATE BATTLE.

Three Thousand Cubans Fight a Smaller Spanish Force.

WILD FIGHTING IN SANTA CLARA.

Resolute Fought on Wounded to Retain - Other Items from the Seat of War.

New York, Oct. 22.—Reports of a desperate battle in the San Juan mountains, between Cuban and Spanish forces, were confirmed by dispatches received by the Cuban general last night. The forces engaged were led by General Antonio Maceo, with 3,000 Cubans, and General Sagor, with 1,500 Spaniards. The general position of the Cubans was not entirely changed, according to the report, but continued the advance to the west after a battle. Only 900 Spanish soldiers remained in the San Juan mountains, and the Cuban troops were confirmed to have been victorious. The Spanish troops were defeated at several points and did not fight with the vigor which distinguished their success in their last battle. General Maceo's western movement was for the purpose of securing the mountain passes to Santa Clara province, as he received word that the Spaniards were about to be defeated by the Cubans.
