PROVO.

Ogden, Utah.—Sept. 18, 1895.

Two men, Farnum and Washington, are under investigation for attempted or attempting to burn down the city. One of them is accused by name or place of being the author of the fire, as all traces point to all residents.

County Court.

The county commissioners met yesterday.

The matter of fixing the compensation of City Clerk, Hanner, was brought up, but put off for one more week without any action.

The Hon. John Cates, presented at a former session of the Board, and asking for the assignment of tax and certificates to certain lots in Morgan Park, was granted.

Albert Bullock's claim of \$177 for services rendered was reduced to \$150 and denied paid.

The monthly report of the experiment of the poor farm was read and filed.

In the past three has been considerable discussion as to the charges of the sheriff in his official labors, these being set out in his guidelines. The following is the gist of a mass of rules adopted yesterday:

All bills must be turned in, and when given to the receiver, he must hold the bill meet show what cost the officer was sent from, and when fine must be served.

Mileage will not be allowed in the service, unless it can be shown the way is made, and then only one way, and that to be the shortest practicable route.

Mileage will not be allowed beyond the limits of the county, except the authority is issued by the warrant of the sheriff, or by the county attorney, and O. K'd, by the county attorney.

Notices for telegraphing or telephoning to be allowed, unless authorized by the county attorney.

Notices will be given for any peace officer, available for assisting in making arrests of criminals; and mileage will not be allowed in recovering stolen property, unless necessary for the prosecution and conviction of the offender.

The matter of re-establishing the driving line between Salterville and Perry school districts was referred to Sheriff.

A number of claims were allowed and disallowed was taken in one week.

Refusing to Pave.

Commissioner James' resolution, introduced at the last session of the city council in relation to paving the ground occupied by the Ogden City Street Railway company tracks on Twenty-first street, was charging the expense to the city, did not receive the support of that corporation. The railway company refuses to do the paving on the grounds that they "don't have to," the franchise not making it compulsory. The Mayor, however, obtained from Ogden city council that the railway company shall do the paving, an effort will be made to enforce the conditions of that franchise.

Fourth District Court.

On Monday, Judge Miner had the following suit before him at Logan: Edward O. Allen vs. Logan City, wherein the plaintiff sued for \$10,000 damages sustained through a bank owing to him while in the employ of Logan city. The lawsuit was dismissed and brought in a verdict in favor of Allen in the sum of \$200.

T. W. Thaxter vs. A. V. Robinson, case was argued and submitted to the court.

Lou Zitman, the plasterer, it is alleged, has been violating one of the city ordinances by making connections with the public sewers without first obtaining a permit to do so. Zitman has been given a fine of \$100.

As the distance to the nearest neighbors was half a mile, the house was destroyed, part assistance being given by the fire department. The loss is said to be fully covered by insurance.

A serious runaway occurred on Monday night, when the lake, today, was dry. Two boys were in a wagon when a pair of large horses took fright and started to run. The boys in attempting to hold the team were thrown out. One of them was draged along the ground, and the other was severely beaten. It was with great difficulty that some men captured the team before any further damage was done.

John Allen was boating on Utah lake in Manti with his two children, father for safety, when the boat overturned in almost five feet of water. It required a great deal of skill to turn the boat right side up, and the little ones from drowning.
