HOST EXPERIENCES.

QUEEN CASES OF NIGHTMARE DEVELOPED IN A WASHINGTON HOTEL.

"Among the many queer experiences gained in a hotel," said the clerk of an up-to-date hotelery, "are those connected with the queen subject to nightmares, which is more common than many people suppose. It is not uncommon for a night in a large hotel to develop several cases of this kind. The hall boy wakes up, rubs his eyes and awakes to see what is coming, and if he is a new comer the hotel boy expects that a murder is being committed."

"We had a case not long ago of a gentleman here who, during the middle of the night, began pounding on his door, yelling at the same time: 'Let me out, let me out! Help! Help!' He had rung the bell for the clerk and, with the night clerk and the porter, hurried back to the room whence came the sounds of distress. They waited awhile, then knocked. He explained that he had eaten a too liberal supply of deviled eggs during the previous evening and that he had dreamed that he was held in prison in some vaults of the Treasury, which he had seen during his visits to the city. His own fears for his safety caused him to wake. Such cases, more or less exciting, are of almost nightly occurrence, and more or less common, especially when the seasonal season is at its height. The guests who get intoxicated are not included in this class of novelties. They form a separate study alone, and make the night doubly very often."—Washington Post.
