

TELEGRAPHIC. HURLED TO DEATH.

Eight Persons Killed in a Collision on the Big Four.

THE CAUSE OF THE ACCIDENT.

A Number of Passengers Injured, Some of Whom Will Die of the Injuries Received.

CHICAGO, Sept. 18.—Eight were killed and others injured in a fall-out collision on the Big Four road near Kansas tonight. The first section of a special passenger train which left Chicago early in the evening and stopped for some unknown reason at Mackinac, and the second section, coming in at full speed, crashed into the rear end.

The wrecked train was the first section of the Big Four express for Chicago, which, owing to the crowd of travel, was running tonight in three sections. These were few minutes apart. The last car of the first section was a sleeper with no passengers, and it is stated now (2:35 a.m.) that no red lights were being on its rear platform.

The first section had been stopping at Mackinac for a few minutes when the second section, running along and crashed into it, drawing the empty sleeper into the engine ahead.

It is now known that the train was badly wrecked, and that the bodies of eight persons were killed. The bodies of the others are being taken to Chicago, Ky., of the injured a number will die.

CHICAGO, Sept. 18.—Kansas and Oklahoma were swept today by another hot wind.
