

TELEGRAPHIC. HURLED TO DEATH.

Eight Persons Killed in a collision on the Big Four.

THE CAUSE OF THE ACCIDENT.

A Number of Passengers Injured, Some of Whom Will Die of the Injuries Received.

CORONADO, Sept. 18.—Eight were killed and sixteen injured in a tail-end collision in the Big Four road near Kanakasburgh. The first section of a special passenger train which left Chicago early in the evening had stopped for some unknown reason at Marion, and the second section, coming in at full speed, crashed into the rear.

The wrecked train was the first section of the Big Four express for Chicago, which owing to the number of trains, was running in three sections. These were five minutes apart. The last car on the first section was a sleeper with no passengers, and it is stated now (2:35 p.m.) that no light was seen on its rear platform.

The first section had been stopped at Marion and had a few minutes when the second section passed along and crashed into it, drawing the empty sleepers after it.

It is now known that eight were killed, but the only one identified so far is David Jackson of Cynthiana, Ky. Of the injured a number will die.

Swept by a Hot Wind.

KANSAS CITY, Sept. 18.—Kansas and Oklahoma were swept today by another hot wind. The day was obscured by clouds most of the day, but the temperature rose to 95 degrees in the city and in various parts of the state. The temperature was recorded as high as 97 and 98 degrees. Late afternoon, it was suddenly changed by the hot breath, having been fully heated and all vegetation parched to a cinder.

London, Sept. 18.—A dispatch dated yesterday, received yesterday by a London firm, says the representatives in the foreign banks at Rio have decided not to open until the crisis is over. The new anti-slavery Republic, which follows the imperial fleet under cover & passage that might cross the river, will sweep the bay after a month's stay with the government. This is the only way to secure a peace, with the object of including the southern parts. The other vessels of the foreign fleet are expected to follow the Republics at an early date.

IN A STATE OF ANARCHY.

MONTREAL, Sept. 18.—It is not known here yet whether Rio has been taken by the revolutionaries. Their barricades have been raised. An entire week has passed since the journal was issued. Passengers who came here from Rio by the steamer Magdalena say that when they left the city it was in a state approaching anarchy.

The captain of the Magdalena says he is probably in a state of anarchy. The editor of the Rio Journal, a newspaper, was literally surrounded by arms, owing to his outspoken support of the South. A Brazilian general, who has been here for a week, says that the time remained peaceful to Palermo, but at last joined the freed navy.
